Engaging Candidates at Events

To find events in your area: take a look at our website, the social media of your local candidates, or other politically active organizations in your district.

Searching "WA candidate forums LD __" online can also yield results.

Leading up to an election, many candidates will participate in events to show their communities that they are committed to their priorities.

There are a wide range of events including: debates, town halls, forums, and meet & greets.

These events are the perfect opportunity to hear your candidates speak!

Some events will allow attendees to submit questions for the candidates. If you want a question to be asked at an event, make sure you prepare beforehand!

After an event can be the perfect time to make a connection. Sending a thank you note or introducing yourself as a constituent will make a great impression.



To submit a question for an event, go to the website of the event host! Sometimes there will be a submission form there you can fill out!

Otherwise, you can email them with your questions using the general email provided on their website!

Questions to Ask Candidates

Here are some sample questions:

"Recent polls show that child care and early education is a priority for approximately 87% of Washington voters. How would you support culturally responsive, quality child care and ensure providers are paid a living wage if elected/re-elected?"

"How would you work in the legislature to support child care providers and ensure families can find and afford care?"

If the capital gains tax goes away, how will you work to make sure that childcare is a priority?

Voting for Childcare

Improving childcare in Washington starts at the ballot box. Make sure your voice is heard on Election Day!

You can click <u>here</u> to check if you are registered to vote in WA state or <u>here</u> to register to vote if you haven't already!



October 18th - Start of the 18-day voting period.
October 28th - Last day to change your voter registration.
November 5th - Election Day! Turn in your ballot by 8pm!

40% of parents report having to quit their job -- or being fired-- since having kids.

More than 300,000 children under 5 years old with working parents don't have access to state licensed child care.

Washington's child care crisis costs our economy \$6 billion every year, both in costs to businesses and lost wages for families.

The median cost for an infant in a child care center in Washington state has increased 74% over a decade
